How do we identify whether a child has a speech, language and communication need, requiring speech and language therapy?

#### Cause for concern

## A cause for concern is identified through:

- Parental concerns
- Identified through health services
- Staff concerns using the Chatterbug Referral Guidelines (to be updated)



#### **Parent Concerns**

Concerns are logged on CPOMS under SALT and Short Note.

## **Health Services**

School work closely with health services

Children may have been identified through health services

## **Teacher Concerns**

Concerns are logged on CPOMS under SALT and Short Note.

Staff should speak to parents about their concerns and gain consent for any referrals

# **Speech, Language and Communication Support**

Our Speech, Language and Communication support is detailed in our whole school provision map and our tiers of SLCN support.



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#### Seaside SALT

A referral can be made to Seaside SaLT Speech and Language Therapy.

Details of the concern and background information will be submitted before the child is seen by a Speech and Language Therapist.

The child may receive targeted SALT therapy.

# **NHS SALT**

A referral can be made by school or health services.

The child may be seen by an NHS Therapist.

A NHS therapy plan may be delivered in school.

## **SEND Support**

A child may be or may be placed on the SEND register.

They will receive targeted support through and Individual Provision Map (see SEND policy)
