





What makes animals different?

Key Vocabulary	
Continent	A large area of land joined together. There are 7 continents in the world.
Equator	An imaginary line around the middle of a planet.
North Pole	The northernmost point on the earth located in the Arctic Ocean.
South Pole	The southernmost point on earth located in Southern or Antarctic Ocean.
Rain stick	A long, hollow tube partially filled with small pebbles or beans.
Climate	Climate is the variation of weather conditions over long periods of time.

Animals

Key Vocabulary

Amphibians	Live in the water as babies and land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin. They are cold blooded. Lay eggs in water.
Birds	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings. Most can fly. Warm blooded. Lay eggs.
Fish	Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills. Cold blooded.
Mammals	Animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby. Warm blooded.
Reptiles	All reptiles breathe air through lungs. They have scales on their skin. Cold blooded. Lay eggs on land.
Carnivore	Animals that eat other animals. (meat)
Herbivore	Animals that eat only plants.
Omnivore	Animals that eat plants and other animals.
