Vocabulary	
Leisure	Free time. Time for you to spend doing something away from school or work.
Entertainment	An activity designed to give pleasure, enjoyment, diversion, amusement, or relaxation to an audience, no matter whether the audience participates passively as in watching opera or a movie, or actively as in games.
Century	A period of 100 consecutive years
Decade	An historical period of the ten years in which the beginning year ended in "0" and the ending year ended in "9".
Holiday	A period of one or more days taken off work by an employee for leisure.
Camp	An outdoor place acting as temporary accommodation in tents or other temporary structures.
FA Cup and World Cup	An event or competition where competitors and/or teams from several different countries to establish a world champion.
Broadcast	Communicated, signalled, or transmitted through radio waves or electronic means.
Butlins	The name of a holiday camp like Haven.
Software	Encoded computer instructions, usually modifiable.
Coronation	The act of crowning a sovereign (king or queen).

What I should already know
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scarborough has been a popular holiday destination for the last 200 years. • Until relatively recently, people stayed in the UK and did not often travel abroad to go on holiday. • Advancements in technology and transport in the last 100 years has led to more people travelling around the world. • Periods of time are organised into decades and centuries.

Who was Billy Butlin?
<p>Sir William Heygate Edmund Colborne Butlin was a South African-born British businessperson whose name is the same as the British holiday camp. Although holiday camps such as Warner's existed in one form or another before Butlin opened his first in 1936, it was Butlin who turned holiday camps into a multimillion-pound industry and an important aspect of British culture.</p>
